If more time than that elapses the series will need to begin again (two additional doses, administered 2 to 4 weeks apart). Normal charges for any additional vaccines due to being beyond the 6-week window will apply.		
 Bordetella (kennel cough) and canine influenza are not part of the program and would be an additional fee. Annual Leukemia vaccine for outdoor cats is not part of the program and would be an additional fee. These will be discussed and recommended depending on your pet's lifestyle. The PLUSAdditional Savings: Pets that are enrolled in the program are eligible for:					

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- 10% discount on spays and neuters.
- 10% discount on dental cleanings.



Additional requirements and how the Free Vaccines for Life program works:

- After enrollment, your pet will receive the vaccines offered by this program for free for the rest of their life, only while they are under the care of Monroe Animal Hospital.
- Preventative Care visits, Blood Parasite Screenings, Intestinal Parasite Screenings at any other veterinary clinic or hospital will not fulfill the requirement to stay enrolled in program.
- The enrollment fee is per pet and is non-refundable and non-transferable. If your pet passes away, or is lost, it cannot be transferred to a new pet. Nor can it be transferred to a new owner if you give your pet away.
- The Owner is responsible for additional costs at the time of the appointment. Veterinary and technician services, lab work and exam fees are not included in the program. Exams must be performed within 1-2 months of the vaccination date, or another exam will be performed and charged for.
- What if the appointment is not done annually? In order to stay enrolled and make this program useful to you and your pet, we must see your pet within 13 months of their last Preventative Care Exam. If you do not come in for the exam within that time frame, then your policy becomes null and void. If this happens, you may either purchase vaccines and exams individually from that time on, or you may re-enroll in the program.
- * If the heartworm test for dogs or Felv/FIV test for cats was done at another licensed veterinary facility or shelter prior to adoption, that test results will be honored. *



We strongly believe it is critical for pets to have regular physical exams, including parasite screenings. Unlike humans, pets often give no indication that there is anything wrong until a problem is advanced and more difficult to treat. Preventive care visits give us the opportunity to give your pet a thorough physical exam, look for subtle changes, talk about your pet's lifestyle, and answer any questions you have.

We follow the vaccination recommendations of the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA). American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA) and the American Association of Feline Practitioners (AAFP) to tailor our vaccination protocol based on your pet's lifestyle.
